Winterheat

WINTERHEAT is a month long amateur radio simplex operating event. The goal and purpose is for amateur radio operators to make as many contacts as possible over a month long period of time using only designated VHF/UHF FM and digital voice simplex frequencies. The event had over 1,000 registered participants in 2022. All contacts must be made during the event period: 0001 January 1, 2023, to 2359 January 31, 2023. Volunteers on the Air

By now, you may have heard of the ARRL Volunteers on the Air operating event for 2023. This is similar to the ARRL Centennial Celebration in 2014 in that if you make on-the-air contact with an ARRL volunteer, you get points that will accumulate on an online leaderboard. Christmas message from Grimeton Station

Grimeton Radio Station (SAQ) is a longwave transatlantic wireless telegraphy station in southern Sweden that is now preserved as a historical site. It is the only remaining example of an early preelectronic radio transmitter. Construction on Grimeton started in 1922 and the VLF station was still on the air in regular service into the 1980s. The operators at Grimeton will be on the air transmitting Christmas greetings December 24, 2022, starting at 0730 UTC using VLF (17.2 kHz) with callsign SAQ and using various HF frequencies with callsign SK6SAQ.
