The club update is how ARRL knows that the club is still in business and keeps the contact information current. This helps ARRL HQ, the Indiana Section Staff, and prospective amateur radio operators know how to contact clubs in their area.

Should two years pass, and no update is made to the report, the club will be listed as inactive, until the report is updated. Please complete all the required information.

We had a very active SKWARN Event on March 31 in Allen County. 2 Tornados touched down in the Northeast Quadrant of the county with some significant damage.

Hamfest conflicts

I wrote a few weeks ago about how I see hamfests as more of a social gathering than a buying/selling opportunity. But, we can't ignore the enterprise side of hamfests, either. Buyers and sellers have to feel that your hamfest satisfied their needs or they will likely look elsewhere.

A few weeks ago, there were two hamfests in Indiana on the same day. They were about 175 miles apart, so probably no big deal. But, we have two hamfests coming up on April 29 that are about 70 miles apart and there will be two hamfests on October 14 that are about 60 miles apart.

As Section Manager, I have no authority over the scheduling of hamfests. And, I recognize that hamfest organizers are sometimes at the mercy of the venues when it comes to dates. But, going forward, I hope that organizers will consider the world around them when scheduling hamfests. Subdividing a small pool of vendors and attendees is not a recipe for success.

Hamfest conflicts, part 2

There used to be a newspaper cartoon called "Pogo" written by Walt Kelly. One of the more famous lines attributed to Pogo is: "We have met the enemy and he is us." That certainly applies to the scheduling of hamfests.

I've received lots of feedback about my comments on hamfest scheduling. And, I understand that one of the hamfests in question is looking at the possibility of moving to a different date. Watch this space.

For any club in the planning stages for a hamfest, I recommend checking the hamfest listings on the ARRL website and checking with me to see if I know of other events in the planning stages.

Repair Cafe

Ever heard of Repair Cafe (https://www.repaircafe.org/en/). The idea is that you bring people who have broken appliances or electronics devices together with people who have the skills to repair them. The idea started in Europe, but it's starting to take hold in the U.S. Right now, there are no Repair Cafes in Indiana--the closest are in Chicago and Cincinnati.

But, is this a concept that clubs could tackle with regard to amateur radio repairs within their own community? I often hear from hams who have a radio, amplifier, or other piece of equipment that's not working correctly and they have no idea where to take it for repairs. Could your club be that destination?


